### Learning Disability Directorate

**Overview:** The Learning Disability directorate seeks to provide person centred, value based, and quality services for adults with a learning disability and/or carers and provides education on learning disability issues across Gwent.

The Learning Disabilities directorate is comprised of 24 hour residential services, Multidisciplinary Community Teams (CLDT's), Health Liaison and specialist services including Intensive Community Support Team & Ty Lyfant a seven bed inpatient facility for people who require assessment & treatment in a hospital setting.

This leaflet focuses on our **inpatient services** and seeks to provide potential applicants with information on our services.

Torfaen	Ty Lyfant	7 Beds	Ty Lafant is a 7 bedded acute adult assessment and treatment unit which provides in-patient care for adults with a learning disability. It is a mixed ward for men and women with learning disabilities and additional health needs who may engage in behaviours that challenge, have mental ill health or neurological conditions. It is based on the Llanfrechfa Grange site, Cwmbran.	The team consists of a Senior Nurse, Ward Manager, a Deputy ward manager, Clinical Lead, Registered Learning Disability Nurses, Behavioural Clinical Specialist, Healthcare Support Workers, Psychologist, Assistant Psychologist, Occupational Therapist, and with access to other multi-disciplinary

The service provides care, treatment and support to five men and women in a homely environment.</p>	<p>The staff team which includes Registered Learning Disability Nurses and Health Care Support Workers who also have additional therapeutic roles. The teams also receives multidisciplinary support from the local Community Learning Disability Team (CLDT) including Consultant Psychiatry, Psychology, Occupational Therapy, Speech and Language Therapy, Art Therapies and input from Dietetics and Physiotherapy when required.</p>
