Overview:

The Adult Mental Health Directorate provides a number of services for patients with wide ranging mental health issues between the ages of 18 and 65, from crisis support; inpatient treatment; community support as well as specialist services across the whole of Gwent.

This information leaflet focuses on our **inpatient patient services** and seeks to provide potential applicants with information on our hospitals, locations and wards.

It is a mixed ward for individuals who are detained under specific sections of the Mental Health Act and who are in an acutely disturbed phase of serious mental disorder, resulting in increased risks that seriously compromises their physical or psychological well-being, or that of others. PICU provides expert, supportive, individualised care for our patients who have an acute psychiatric condition and who require a safe, specialist environment for a short period of time. Beechwood unit is a low secure facility which means that all exterior exit doors are kept locked at all times. The unit recently underwent a full refurbishment to increase the number of beds and Extra Care Area Facilities.
