\*Exposure prone procedure (EPP)

Working with NHS



"Exposure prone procedures (EPP) are those where there is a risk that injury to the worker may result in the exposure of the patient's open tissues to the blood of the worker. These include procedures where the worker's gloved hands may be in contact with sharp instruments, needle tips and sharp tissues (e.g.spicules of bone or teeth) inside the patients open body cavity, wound or confined anatomical space where the hands or fingertips may not be completely visible at all times".*Department of Health 1998, General Principles of BBV Infection Control and Exposure Prone Procedures*.

**EPP Workers** are required to be seen in Occupational Health <u>before</u> commencing EP Procedures. Only when clearance is given by OH will the worker be allowed to commence EPP.
