Job summary:

- To create and maintain a safe, therapeutic, clinical environment for all patients and their relatives/care givers within the Post operative Recovery area.
- To proactively coordinate all functions and activities within the Post-operative Care environment.
- In conjunction with the Theatres and Anaesthetic Matron and Clinical Leads, to manage Post-operative Care resources of clinical area within the budgetary limitations e.g., finance, equipment and staff.
- To provide strong leadership of the nursing and support workers that is motivating, supportive, and sets clear boundaries, resulting in high quality safe patient care.
- To support a clinical learning environment that enables nursing staff to develop professionally and promotes the use of evidence-based practice.

Key Responsibilities:

Communication

- Communication is a fundamental process to ensure continuity and high standards of care. It includes sharing ideas, information and feedback in order to empower patients and members of the health care team.
- Utilises a variety of strategies to communicate with patients and those involved in their care to optimise the patients journey and ensure an informed decision making process.
- Liaises closely with Theatres, recovery, CCU and wards, maintaining good communication to ensure continuity of patient care.
- Accepts responsibility for establishing and maintaining productive inter-professional working relationships.

Clinical

- Demonstrate highly advanced clinical skill.
- Assess, plan, deliver and evaluate programmes of care in partnership with the patient and their family/carers.
- Lead the development, implementation and evaluation of evidence based, specialist, Day Surgery pathways of care.
- Work in close liaison with the multi-disciplinary team to ensure that patient care is delivered safely, clinically effective and research based.
- Initiate, co-ordinate and participate in interdisciplinary audit and research projects to improve the quality of care and promote clinical effectiveness.
- Practice as a clinical Nurse/ODP on a regular basis, with expertise, confidence and authority, acting as a role model for nursing staff and promoting a patient-centred approach to all aspects of care.

Managerial

- Participate in the recruitment of staff and in the strategies for recruitment and retention of staff
- Implement Trust policies for the management of peoples' problems i.e. poor performance, sickness/absence



- Manage complaints from patients and relatives in accordance with the Trust complaints procedure.
- Participate in Unit / Clinical Delivery Group (CDG), Trust, internal /external training as required.
- Promote best practice in health, safety and security in accordance with Trust policies.
- Take responsibility for the day-to-day management of the Day Surgery unit.
- In the absence of the Clinical Lead be prepared to make decisions to ensure safe and effective practice will be delivered in accordance with legal, professional and Trust guidelines.
- Participate in resource management actively participating in the supervision of resources at team level.
- To be responsible and accountable for ensuring that all staff under your direction comply with Trust Policies and clinical guidelines.

Education

- To share and promote own specialist knowledge and skills with pre and post registration students and other health care professionals.
- Promote an environment conducive to learning and the recruitment / retention of staff.
- Participate in the delivery and coordination of induction / orientation programmes for new staff.
- To develop in house teaching and staff development strategies to support individuals personal objectives in line with appraisals and pay progression
- To support the Day Surgery Unit Leads in ensuring that Appraisals and regular 1:1's take place for all staff and that identified training needs are met.
- Ensure training and development needs identified in the individual's personal development plan are followed up and assist staff to identify their development needs and to promote a learning culture.
- Ensure the Department Induction Training and all necessary training to meet health and safety and statutory requirements is in place and is appropriately reviewed.

Professional/Personal

- Lead in the development of evidence-based guidelines to support the development of day surgery.
- Attend department, Divisional meetings and Trust meetings as required, disseminating information to others.
- Maintain a relevant portfolio of evidence.
- To prepare and actively participate in Trusts annual Appraisal process and progress reviews.
- Take accountability for your Appraisal objectives to ensure your training needs are met and evaluated in terms of self, patient and service.
- In conjunction with line manager, be responsible for identifying and achieving personal and professional development needs by accessing the appropriate education/training programmes.
